The Retrofit Summit is a one-day policy conference dedicated to the refurbishment and energy efficient retrofit of existing buildings.

The Summit builds on the success of last year's Retro Expo, which took place over three days at the NEC and attracted over 3500 clients, specifiers and installers - making the show the UK's leading event dedicated to refurbishment and retrofit.
